School Production

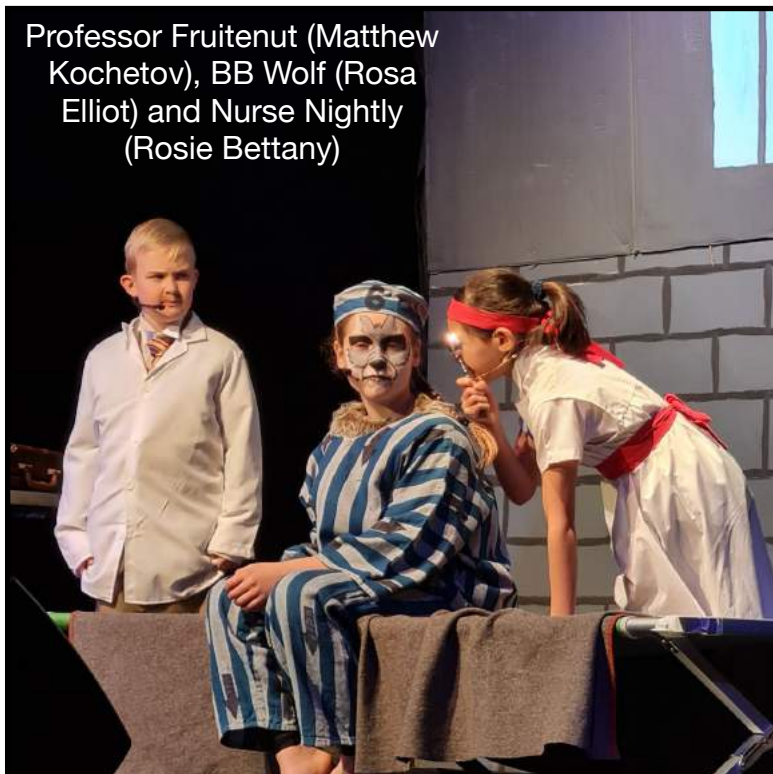
With regret we have had to cancel our School Production for this year. We had a postponement date set for being at COVID-19 Level 1 as at the beginning of Term 4.
