## **Whaanau Learning Snapshots**

The Senior School (Room's 2, 3, 4 and 5) Whaanau Learning Snapshots that were postponed from last term will be held this coming Monday 6th and Tuesday 7th May at 6pm.

This evening is intended to replace our previous Term 1 parent teacher interviews with an informative evening that guides you through how learning, assessment and acceleration takes place in our kura.

We believe these evenings will give you a good insight into how your child learns within our Kura, how our literacy, numeracy, te reo Māori and other curriculum areas run and how we can best help your child succeed. As we are at the beginning of the school year, we believe it is more beneficial to get together as a community and tautoko our tamariki as a collective, rather than on an individual basis. Formal parent teacher interviews and a school report will still take place at the end of Term 2, followed by formal school report at the end of Term 4.

We invite all our parents/caregivers/whaanau of our Room 2, 3, 4 and 5 students to attend.



At the end of last term Room 4 finished up their fossil art. They tried to replicate a background that looked like a natural rock wall, similar to the fossiling wall we used at Port Waikato Camp. To do this they used sponges to apply different shades of yellow, orange and brown to the paper. Then scrunching the paper to create a 3D rock effect. To create their fossils, they worked hard to draw realistic looking shells and then shaded them to look 3D also.
