7th June 2019.

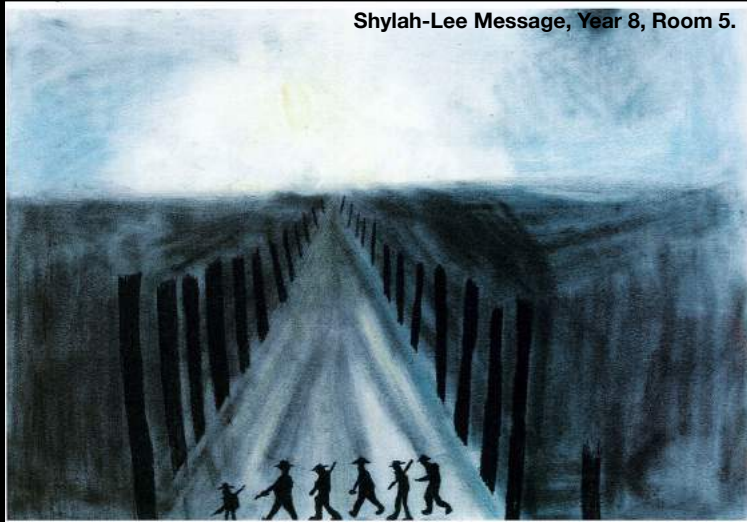

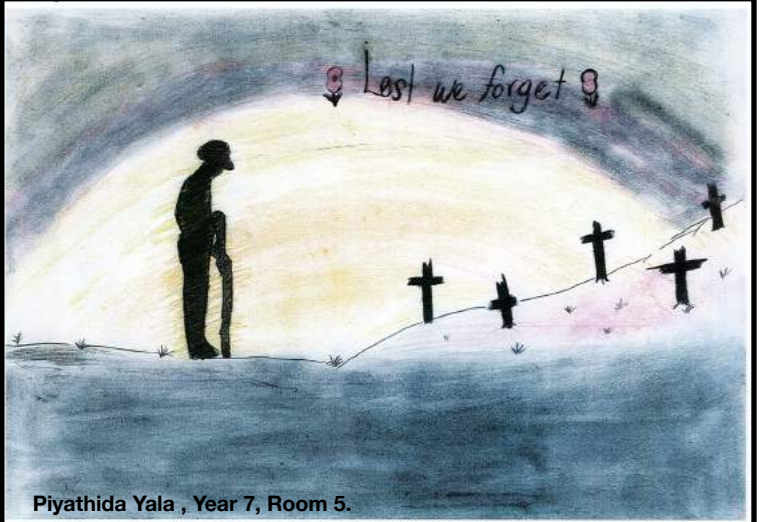

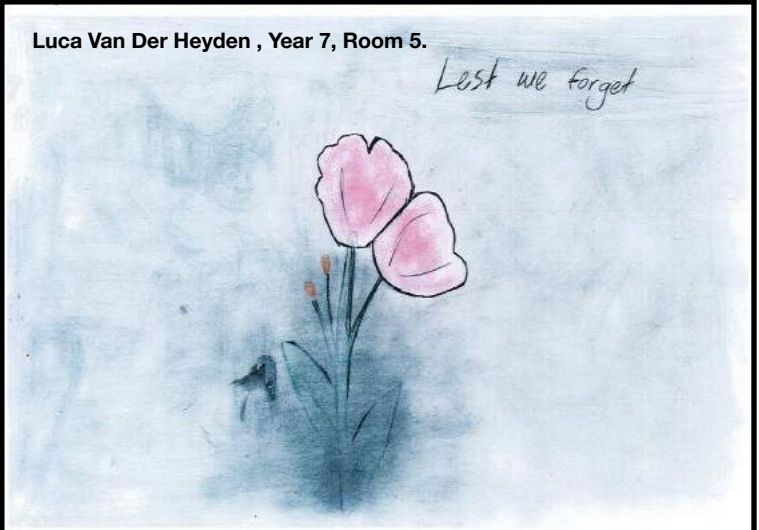
