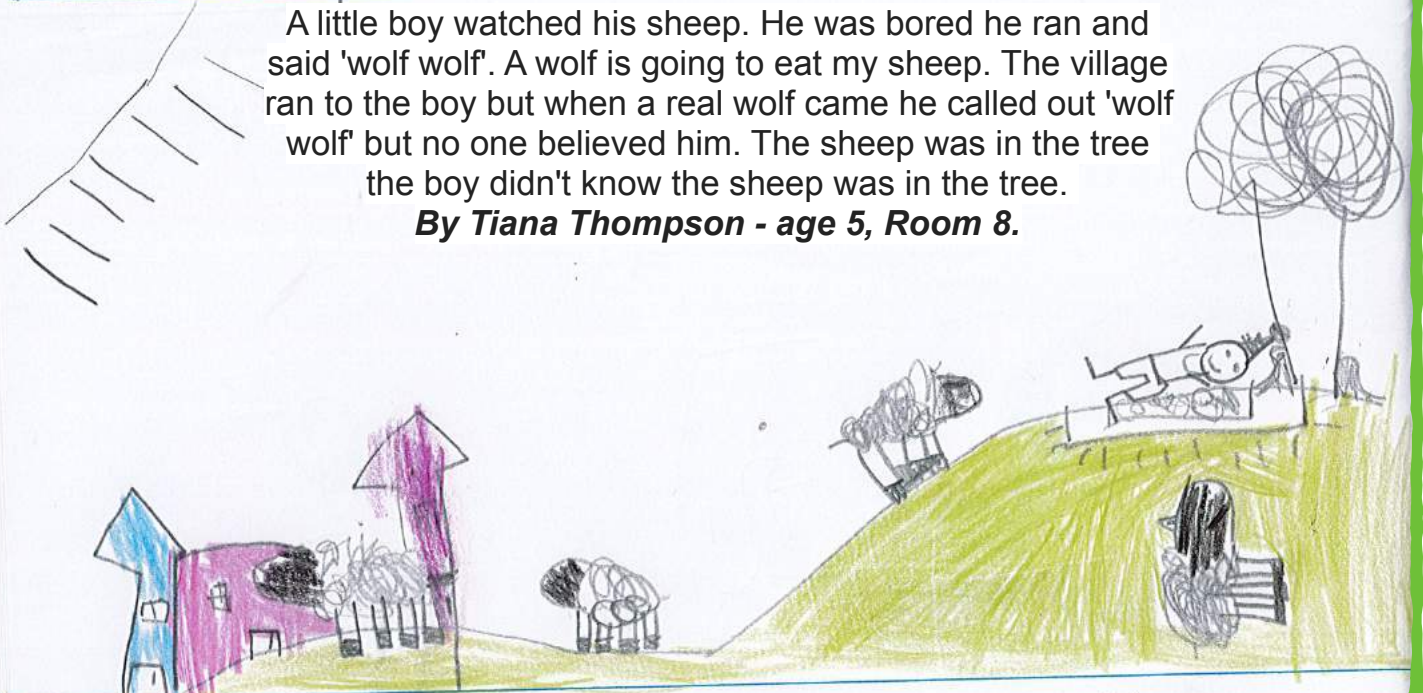
Notices have gone home today to those parents who are yet to join Class Dojo. You are welcome to come to school to see Carol who will download the app on to your phone if you require.

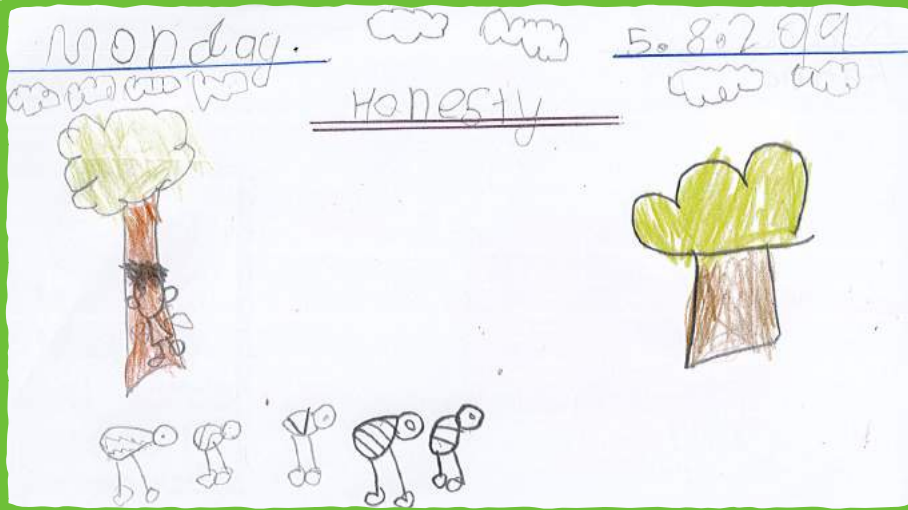
