Rule: No stop - parking at 3pm. Stop, load, drive off.

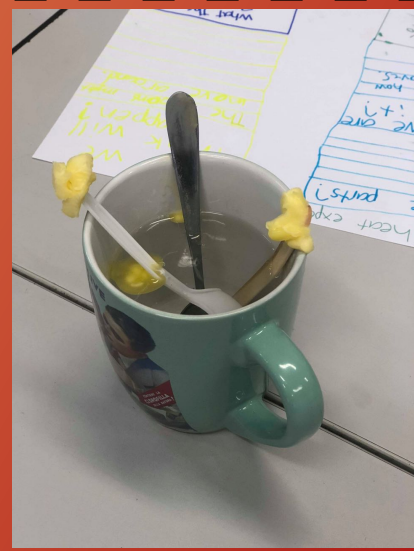

How does heat move?

Splash! went the butter as it slid into the hot water. The butter slid in like people skiing down a mountain. Our experiment was about seeing how heat moves. For this experiment we needed, butter, 7 ice block sticks, 7 plastic spoons, hot water, 7 mugs and 7 metal spoons. HOW HEAT MOVES

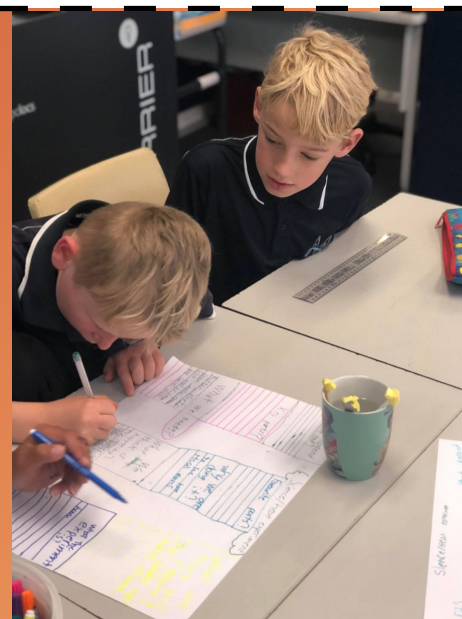
Slip, splash! The butter was sliding down the metal spoon like it was sliding down a slide. "Look!" said Jade. When I looked at the butter on the popsicle stick, it was everywhere. Down the cup, on the table, in the cup and on the stick. We were doing a science experiment to see how heat moves.

This experiment included 7 metal and plastic spoons, 7 popsicle sticks, 7 cups, 21 small pieces of butter and hot water. We put small pieces of butter on the ends of our metal spoon, plastic spoon and popsicle sticks. Then Miss Morrison poured hot water into our mugs and we watched closely to see what was going to happen. The butter started to melt on the silvery, shiny metal spoon. Plop! Next the butter slid down the spoon and into the water,

turning it bubbly and yellow. After a while we sat on the mat and talked about why the butter on the metal spoon slid first. I think it is because when the hot water touches the metal spoon it makes the spoon as hot as the sun and melts the butter.

This is called conduction.
